

Excerpt from Review of Labor Legislation of 1909 For the convenience of our members the labor laws enacted by the forty-two states holding legislative sessions in 1909 are analyzed below in alphabetical order by subjects and by states with chapter reference to the session laws of each state. Accidents Minnesota, New York and Wisconsin are investigating the causes and costs of accidents. On the basis of the results obtained each state will draft a bill for the compensation of injured workmen. Maine and Texas have this year required accident statistics to be reported and published. Connecticut - Persons in charge of manufacturing establishments must mail to the factory inspector within fifteen days a full account of all accidents which result in death or one week s absence from work. Maximum penalty, \$20.00. Information is confidential and a factory inspector cannot be a competent witness in court proceedings unless he was present when the accident occurred. (c.150) Illinois - Persons in charge of factories, mills or mercantile establishments must immediately report to the chief factory inspector all injuries...
